3.1.- FROM SPAIN

By train (Renfe ♂)

- Madrid León route by high speed train: 2
 hours and 15 minutes (approximately).
- In Madrid, trains to León depart from Madrid Chamartín Station.

By bus (Alsa ♂)

Madrid – León route by direct bus: 4
hours (approximately).

In Madrid, buses to León stop at Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas Airport, at the Estación Sur Bus Station and at the Moncloa Interchange Station.

By plane (Air Nostrum)

• Although the only regular destination operated by León Airport

is Barcelona, in summer some seasonal flights are made to other destinations. It is recommended to consult the website for updated information.


In private vehicle

- Main national communication hubs converge in Leon, which allows the comfortable and simple arrival to the city by private vehicle.

3.2.- FROM OUTSIDE SPAIN

- Most of the international flights to Spain land at Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas Airport (Madrid, 343 km from León) or at Barcelona-El Prat Airport (Barcelona, 784 km from Leon)).

For two weeks you will live an intense program combining practical workshops, seminars and role-play activities with leisure activities and sightseeing tours around the city.

In advance you will know what your group is and you will be able to consult the <u>detailed academic</u> <u>program</u> o in the web of the event. This page is updated periodically, we recommend you check it to be aware of possible news.

The overcoming of the program involves the attendance of 68 hours of face-to-face training and the completion of 82 hours of individual work by the student, which is equivalent to 6 ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System).

If you participate in the Policy Maker intensive program, the course includes 45 hours of face-to-face training and 105 hours of individual work, equivalent to 6 ECTS credits.

At the end of the program, students who have participated in a minimum of 95% of teaching hours will receive a Certificate of Aptitude issued by the University of León (ULe) and a Diploma of attendance issued by the National Institute of Cybersecurity Of Spain (INCIBE) in collaboration with all participating entities.




4.3.- ROLE - PLAY

As part of the training program and as a novelty this edition, Role-Play sessions will be held where groups of about 15 people (mixed attendants from different tracks: CERT, LEA and Policy Makers) will participate in order to foster cooperation between them and work on a case study.

In advance you will know what your group is for Role-Play (different from the training workshops) and you can consult the calendar and details of this activity on the event website.

4.4.- LEISURE PROGRAM

At the end of the training sessions you can rest, enjoy the city or, if you wish, participate in activities of the leisure program that the City of León and INCIBE propose you to make your stay in our city unforgettable.

To facilitate coordination of activities and organization in smaller groups, small teams have been defined and will participate in the activities at different dates and times.

The definition of the leisure program teams is independent of the academic program groups. If the academic program seeks the thematic homogeneity of the participants, in the case of the leisure plan is intended to encourage contact between professionals from different sectors and nationalities. You can enjoy your leisure time by meeting people from different groups.

You will know in advance what your teams are and you will be able to consult in the <u>leisure program</u> of the specific details about date, time and duration of the activity, as well as the meeting point.



Participation in the leisure program is voluntary.

Activity 1: Guided tour of the old town of León.

For two hours, a guide will accompany you on a tour around the heart of the city. Emblematic corners of this historic city will be visited and you will have the opportunity to enjoy the most genuine part of the old town of León.



Activity 2: Monumental visit.

Leon Cathedral. The Pulchra leonina or "beautiful leonese" is the most visited monument of the city and constitutes one of the most spectacular Gothic jewels of Spain. Started in the 13th century, its details include carved porches, colorful stained glass windows, glorious rosettes, as well as one of the oldest choirs in Spain and an organ that each year stars the International Organ Festival of the Cathedral of León.

<u>Count Luna's Palace</u>. So Built in the 14th century and located in the heart of the old town, it is currently the headquarters in Spain of the University of Washington and hosts the Interpretation Center for the History of the Kingdom of León.



Activity 3: Access to sports facilities.

You will be able to access the facilities of the <u>Municipal Sports Center of La Palomera</u> \mathscr{O} on July 22 and 23, with swimming pool, recreation area and sports courts. To enjoy the facilities you must present the accreditation to the event.

4.5.- TRANSPORT PROGRAM

The organization offers private buses to facilitate transfers between venues.

Cybersecurity Summer BootCamp buses stop at the following points, depending on the location of the activity. You can check its location on the $\underline{map\ of\ the\ event}$. \mathcal{O}

- University of León (ULe). CRAI-TIC Building
- INCIBE Headquarters
- Auditorium City of León
- León Oeste Auditorium
- Santo Domingo. In this central place, all the buses of the event stop to facilitate access to attendees hosted in the city center.

In the bus program \mathcal{O} attendees can check the routes of each service. This page is updated on a regular basis, we recommend to check it periodically to be aware of possible updates.

4.6.- DRESS CODE

In all activities of Cybersecurity Summer BootCamp the dress code will be casual, keeping the minimum decorum required in every community act.



5.1.- HOTELS IN LEÓN

The hotel offer in Leon is wide and varied. Depending on the needs of the visitor, the options range from a monastery of 16th century converted into a luxury parador, functional business hotels or cozy charming ones. Emilio Hurtado Residential \mathcal{O} is the official hosting of Cybersecurity Summer BootCamp. Located in the area of the University of León (ULe), one of the venues of the event, is a habitual option among students, professors and staff linked to the University.

It has 144 apartments with 3 single rooms, bathroom, living room and kitchen fully equipped.






How to make a reservation at the Residencial Emilio Hurtado:




We have enabled WiFi networks in the INCIBE Headqarters and the University of León (ULe) so that you can be connected during the workshops.


You can also access the WiFi network from the Emilio Hurtado Residence. Upon your arrival we will provide the connection details.

The password for the INCIBE WiFi network changes daily. Each day we will communicate the new key to students who attend training activities in the INCIBE Headquarters.







Bus






In the city center of Santo Domingo, most urban buses stop and operate as an interchange stop between the different lines of the city.



León is a wonderful city, combining an impressive historical architecture with a fresh and fun atmosphere.

Its impressive cathedral, one of the most beautiful in Spain, is a must see, although there is so much cultural wealth in the streets of Leon that it is difficult to choose which is the emblem of the city. During the day you will find a monumental and calm city, a must for pilgrims on the Camino de Santiago (World Heritage Site by UNESCO). At night León is taken by students, tourists and locals, which floods the narrow streets and squares of the picturesque old town, Barrio Húmedo. It is a fabulous mixture.


